Little Sprouts, located at 35 Church Street, will be staying open until 7:00pm for this event: from 4:00–7:00pm stop in to “Reveal” one of several mystery deals by lifting a flap.

In the Art Gallery, downstairs at the HAYC3 Armory, a Maker’s Market, featuring local artisans and food purveyors, will be held from 5:00–7:00pm. Just in time for the holidays, shop for homemade quilts, jams, syrups, local products, and more.

Also downstairs at the Armory from 5:00–7:00pm, enjoy a free cup of Iron Coffee coffee; free live music performed by Tavo Carbone in the Owl’s Nest; and Hoosick Kitchen Catering homemade soup, bread, and dessert for \$5.
